Use of Stone in Building Course 2019

Introduction

This popular course gives an overview and general knowledge of the design and use of natural stone and takes account of the current needs of those involved in specifying and working with stone. The course gives delegates assistance in selecting and using natural stone in many different ways.

- Masonry and architecture, including external masonry and rain screen cladding
- Stone for interiors
- External paving
- Ethical sourcing, environmental considerations and sustainability of stone.

The course is suitable for qualified and trainee architects, designers, specifiers, surveyors, planners, those who have recently entered the stone industry trade and others who wish to achieve a better understanding of natural stone and its use. Thistle Holborn, The Kingsley, 36-37 Bloomsbury Way, London WC1A 2SD

To reach Thistle Holborn, The Kingsley by road...

At Euston Square, turn right onto Gower Street (A400) which becomes Bedford Square. At the junction with New Oxford Street (A40) turn left onto Bloomsbury Way. The Kingsley hotel is on your left after St. George's Church. To programme your sat-nav, please use the postcode WC1A 2SD.

If you're travelling to Thistle Holborn, The Kingsley by car, the nearest car park is the **Bloomsbury Square Car Park**, which is located at 30 Bloomsbury Square, Bloomsbury, London WC1A 2RJ

If you're coming to Thistle Holborn, The Kingsley by rail...

London Kings Cross/St Pancras and Euston mainline stations are about a mile or a 10-minute cab ride from Thistle Holborn, The Kingsley. The nearest Underground stations are Holborn (Central and Piccadilly lines) and Tottenham Court Road (Northern and Central lines).

From the London airports...

London Heathrow: The Heathrow Express runs directly to London Paddington in 15 minutes (20 minutes from Terminal 5), with a train every 15 minutes. Nearest Underground stations are Holborn (Central and Piccadilly lines) and Tottenham Court Road (Northern and Central lines).

London Gatwick: Take the Gatwick Express to London Victoria (trains every 15 minutes, journey time 30 minutes). Then take the Victoria underground line, changing at Green Park onto the Piccadilly line which runs directly to Holborn.

London City: Take the DLR to Bank then change to the Central underground line to Holborn.

London Stansted: Take the Stansted Express to Tottenham Hale (trains every 15 minutes, journey time 36 minutes). Take the Victoria underground line to Kings Cross, then change to the Piccadilly line which runs directly to Holborn.
