Chichester Cathedral in Chichester, Sussex was formally known as The Cathedral Church of the Holy Trinity and is the seat of the Anglican Bishop of Chichester.

The building was established as a cathedral in 1075, when the seat of the bishop was moved from closeby Selsey. DBR (London) was appointed as Principal Contractor, with DBR Leadwork acting as specialist roofing contractor to carry out the re-roofing using sand cast lead of The Quire and North and South Quire Aisles.

The works incorporated removal of concrete infills to wall plates and general repairs to high level roof construction, along with repairs to high level masonry and rainwater goods.
