The building, originally called the Manor of Lambeth or Lambeth House, has been, for nearly 800 years, the official London residence of the Archbishop of Canterbury in England, in North Lambeth, on the South bank of the River Thames.

The works at the Palace consisted a designed scaffold and temporary roofs, traditional lead and slate roof repairs/replacement; rebuilding of stone parapets, stone replacements, indents and pointing.

Other work consisted a quantity of stonework repairs at four locations, the largest area of which was the Garden Screen Wall on the East side of the main courtyard.
