HSE has joined up with Stone Federation to run a safety and health awareness event specifically for the stone worker industry. It is aimed at stone work operatives and stonemasons, including supervisors and managers. Accident rates in the stone industry are above average for manufacturing, and work on construction sites pose even greater risks. It remains important to manage the health and safety risks in your workplace.

Topics that will be covered in short sessions include the safe **handling of stone slabs**; controlling **silica exposure**; and **hand arm vibration**. Some of the speakers are from HSE.

By attending the half-day event you will:

- Get practical advice in controlling health & safety risks.
- Learn about common hazards & precautions.
- Have the opportunity to ask questions about your legal duties.
- Be able to take ideas back to your workplace to improve or maintain safety.
